According to the World Giving Index, published in June 2022, Uzbekistan took 29th place [2].

In addition, since November 29, 2012, international charity has been organized in about 100 countries of the world under the heading "Generous Tuesday"2. Within the framework of this charity, thousands of people promote the unprecedented positive aspects of generosity among the population and set a personal example. In addition, systematic work is being carried out by the United Nations Organization on issues of education of competences necessary for a person to grow up to be a fully mature and well-rounded generation in the drawing up of prospective cooperation plans with the countries of the world. World scientific research institutions and centers are carrying out scientific research on improving interpersonal relations, forming generosity in children from an early age, correcting greed in child-child relationships, studying the problems of the role of generosity in personal development.

In particular, in these studies, the influence of the family upbringing style on the formation of greed and generosity in children, greed of only children, lack of love and warm feelings for the child in the family, jealousy between brothers or sisters, relations with the child's peers lack of ability to build, low emotional intelligence and other reasons, attention is being paid to studying the factors that cause greed. The reward of 100,000 soums donated by a rich person may be the same as the reward of 1,000 soums donated by a poor person. Because both of them are coming from their opportunities. The reward of charity is based on sincerity and faith.

Hazrat Jabir (may Allah be pleased with him) says: "The Messenger of Allah (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) gave us a sermon and said: "O people! Repent to Allah before you die, hasten to do good deeds before you become busy, and make up for yourselves what is between you and your Lord (i.e. forgiveness) by remembering Him a lot! Increase charity openly and secretly, then you will be provided, you will be successful and you will be strengthened" (narration of Ibn Majah). We should know well that generosity brings blessings in this world and great rewards in the hereafter.
